I have lived at 4s701 Harter Road for the past 25 years and my grandfather was a farmer at the same location since the 1950's. I spent many summers helping him out on his farm. Even as a kid I was well aware of all the trucks coming and going out of the gravel pit next door, which is now partially a landfill and known locally as the "Feltes Pit". It was abruptly shut down in the 1960's for reasons that are still unclear.

The Feltes LLC has returned once again in an effort to disrupt and damage our community with their ill-conceived project that they and their families will never likely have to live with as they are asking us to do. They wish to force this upon us by changing the rules that our community has lived by our entire lives and that suits only them.

They wish to destroy acres of farmland and surviving ancient oak trees and green space that healed over the wound they created in our community with their former gravel pit, now partially a landfill they wish to disturb.
